TATP Source of Event Report



TATP SOURCE OF EVENT REPORT

The **TATP Source of Event Report** is a reporting tool that provides information on the initial source of reports for events entered into NC EDSS. It also provides the username of the person/function (i.e., electronic feed) that created the event. The report has a create date basis, which means the time frame entered in the parameters represents the dates between which events were created. The report can be used to answer the following questions:

“Who is submitting disease reports to public health?”

“Who is creating the disease reports in NC EDSS?”

Utilizing the event source information, LHDs can identify health care providers that may need guidance on reporting requirements under N.C. law. Knowing who creates the disease events in NC EDSS, management can look at workload, efficiency and other internal process reviews.

DIRECTIONS:

You must have a NC EDSS user role of LHD Healthcare Clinician II or Health Director.

Log into NC EDSS. From the **Dashboard**, select the Report icon.

Look in the **Report Menu**. Select the category **“Custom Reports.”**

From the **Select Report** drop down box, choose **“TATP Source of Event.”**

Parameters that must be selected are:

Disease – Because of the structure of the model all the STDs appear as choices. This report is intended for Chlamydia, Gonorrhea and Non-gonorrheal Urethritis. Any one or combination of these may be chosen. To choose multiple diseases, make a selection then hold the control key down while making additional choices.

Start Date and Stop Date - This report uses the date events are marked to report to CDC as a date basis. This means if 01/01/10 is selected as the start date and 01/31/10 is selected as the stop date, all events reviewed and marked to report to CDC during this period will be returned. This date basis will allow reports to align with surveillance data as reported and published in the MMWR. The dates are inclusive so events marked on the start date will be included in the report.

Classification Status – Selects the classification of events to be returned. For STDs this is almost exclusively “Confirmed”.

NC County of Residence for the Event – Selects the county of residence for events returned. Users may select a single county or multiple counties but the events returned will be filtered by the user’s permission and show only those events for the user’s county or shared with the user.

Click on the **“Export Results”** tab to run the report.
