

When you are making a resource referral, you will need to select **Resource** as the **Referral Type**. To learn more about the other types of referrals, please visit <u>the Documenting Referrals in CCTO job aid</u>.

- All individuals who are reached by phone should be asked if they have any resource needs.
- Referrals should only be logged by the person who made the referral(s) and should not be logged simply due to asking if the individual in need of resources.
- A unique referral should be logged for each type of support that the individual was referred for. For example, if someone requests support for housing, food, and transportation, then three referrals will be logged.
- A referral can be made by either providing information to the individual or sharing the individual's information to a supporting organization.

After you have selected that the **Referral Type** is **Resource**, you will then be asked to identify the type of **Referral Need(s)**. Refer to the list below to better understand the types of resource referral needs.

Benefits Navigation	Includes services provided to a client to assist them in navigating the service and/or benefits landscape.	 Benefits Eligibility Screening Health Insurance/Benefits Immigration Services 		
Clothing & Household Goods	Includes services and/or items used to furnish the household and personal goods.	 Appliances Baby Supplies Houseware/Cookware 		
Education	Includes services that assist a client in accessing academic education and achieving literacy. It can also include supportive services and financial assistance to support the obtainment of that education.	 Computer/Technology Classes Assistance to obtain Degrees/Certifications Educational Support Services

Employment	Includes services provided to assist a client in obtaining a new job, which may include job training programs, soft skills training, or actual placement assistance.	 Career Skills Development Internships/Work Experience Job Training 		
Entrepreneurship	Includes any assistance provided to clients to support their small business.	 Entrepreneurial training programs Assistance with securing commercial real estate or permits Small business financing and fundraising 		
Food Assistance	Includes any services that assist a client in obtaining food.	 Food Pantry Prepared Meals SNAP/WIC/Other Nutrition Benefits 		
Housing & Shelter	Includes services in obtaining and maintaining safe and stable housing, including assistance finding temporary or permanent housing and paying for rent/mortgage.	 Assisted Living Emergency Housing Home Loans and Financing

Mental/Behavioral Health	Includes services provided by clinicians to assess, diagnose, treat or professionally counsel individuals to alleviate mental or emotional illness, symptoms, conditions or disorders. Money Management	Includes services that help clients manage and improve their financial situation.	Financial CounselingFinancial Literacy ClassesTaxes		
Physical Health	Includes clinical services provided to promote the physical well-being of individuals and to manage and prevent diseases.	 Home-based Care Medical Expense Assistance Primary Care 		
Social Enrichment	Includes classes and activities focused on building relationships, promoting community, and increasing feelings of social connectedness	 Special Interest Clubs Volunteer Opportunities Peer to Peer Networking 		
Spiritual Enrichment	Includes activities or connections made to local religious or faith-based groups/leaders to improve an individual's sense of spirituality	Faith-based Communities

Transportation	Includes programs that provide for the basic transportation needs of the community.	 Ride Coordination Transportation Expense Assistance Transportation Passes/Vouchers 		
Utilities	Includes programs that provide application/advocacy or financial assistance for people who are at risk of having their utilities shut off.	 Home Energy/Utilities Benefits Utility Bill Payment Assistance 		
Wellness	Includes programs that help participants understand and develop personal practices that enhance their total well-being.	 Alternative Medicine Mindfulness and Meditation Therapeutic Programs & Retreats 		
Other	If none of the other categories fit the service and program, the resource need can be marked as "Other"
