## Documenting Hepatitis B Control Measures for a Hepatitis B Positive Pregnant Mother and Infant Born to a Hepatitis B Positive Mother

Documentation in NC EDSS provides verification that control measures were issued as required by law to a person known to be infected with hepatitis B virus. The following steps are how to document control measures for a Hepatitis B pregnant woman.

- 1. Open the Clinical Package.
- 2. Scroll down to the Isolation/Quarantine/Control Measures section.
- 3. Click "Yes" beside the question "Restrictions to movement or freedom of action?"
- 4. Check all appropriate restrictions imposed by the control measures:
  - a. Sexual behavior
  - b. Blood and bodily fluids
- 5. Enter the date the control measures were issued.
- 6. Enter notes in the text box, if needed. i.e., if control measures were issued over the phone; if a certified letter was mailed to the client and returned to sender; or if control measures were issued by another provider.
- 7. Click "Save."
- 8. If control measures were given face to face and were signed by the person, you can upload a copy of the signed control measures to the event.

The following are steps to document control measures given to parents or guardians of an infant born to a hepatitis B positive mother in the infant's event:

- Review control measures with the parent or guardian regarding infants born to HBsAg-positive
  mothers including obtaining the hepatitis B vaccine and HBIG within 12 hours of birth, obtaining
  the rest of the vaccine series at 1-2 months and 6 months of age, and the collection of the PVST
  at 9-12 months of age or 1-2 months after the last dose of vaccine if the completion of the
  vaccine series is delayed.
- 2. Document when and what control measures were reviewed with the parent or guardian in the notes section on the dashboard of the infant's event.
