



The Grindstaff mine is located on the northeast slope of Chestnut Mountain, 1000 feet southeast of Thunderstruck Knob. It can be reached by traveling on SR 1308 for 5.6 miles north of Micaville to SR 1312. Turn west onto SR 1312 and travel 0.2 mile to the intersection with SR 1319. Turn Northwest onto SR 1319 and follow this road 0.4 mile to its termination. The mine is located about 1000 feet northwest of the end of SR1319 and can be reached on foot by following an abandoned logging road.


