


A. Murdock and Hunter (1946) report the presence of "asbestos" in this area just east of Jacobs Knob. The specific type of asbestos was not given.



Directions to Occurrence:


The occurrence is located North of U.S. Highway 64 west of the community of Gneiss in Macon County. Follow U.S. 64 for 4.5 miles east of its intersection with U.S. Highway 23-441. Take a left (north) onto SR 1534 (Lickskillit Road) and travel 0.6 miles to the occurrence. The intersection of Lickskillit Road and Highway 64 is 1.8 miles west of Gneiss.
