

REPORTING ACUTE PESTICIDE-RELATED ILLNESS AND INJURY



WHAT TO REPORT

North Carolina [10A NCAC 41F.0101 - .0103](#) requires physicians to report any confirmed or suspected cases of acute pesticide-related illness and injury. Nurse practitioners, physicians assistants, and other medical professionals are also encouraged to report.

Report the patient information and product name with the EPA Registration Number of the pesticide, if possible.



WHEN TO REPORT

Cases must be reported immediately if conditions result in death. Otherwise, reports should be made within 48 hours of diagnosis.



HOW TO REPORT

If a pesticide poisoning is suspected, call NC Poison Control at 1-800-222-1222 or complete the following secure form to report to NCDHHS directly at <https://survey.dph.ncdhhs.gov/surveys/?s=A4JCN3ECEC>
